Open WSCA and Arabian show held at Meeker County Fairgrounds, Litchfield MN.



- Q: How did you first get involved in photography? Has it always been your passion?
- A: When I was in middle school, I got my first DSLR camera. I would bring it everywhere and take photos of anything I could find! I started bringing it to the barn and taking photos of the lesson horses. My instructor recommended I reach out to one of the magazines to shoot at horse shows. I tried my hand at it with my trusty Canon T3i and kit lens. Although I had much to beginning of college, most of my time was consumed by school start going back to shoot at horse shows a few years ago, and I haven't stopped since!
- Q: Why did you choose to combine photography with your love of horses?
- A: My love of horses is one of the biggest parts of my life, and I would always be involved with them no matter what. It was much time photographing horses, I realized that taking other types of photos just wasn't as interesting for me. I'm able to be my most creative and inspired when I photograph horses!
- O: Tell us about starting your photography business.
- A : As I developed my skill, I had friends and family who were interested in photoshoots. They helped me realize that I was talented enough to turn my hobby into a business. I did senior photos, family shoots and equine shoots. It was difficult starting out because I didn't know how all the logistics worked how much to charge, what image size to use, etc. I did my research and also did some experimenting to figure out what worked best for me. The rest comes from being social and advertising! So much of it comes from confidence; you need to feel confident in your ability and know your worth, which was something I struggled with for some time. I try to meet new my business has grown.
- Q: How long have you been shooting for National Horseman Arabian? What has been your favorite part thus far?
- A : I've been shooting for NHA for about two years, and my first show shooting for the magazine was Scottsdale 2022. My absolute favorite part is going to all these amazing horse shows and capturing special moments and the beauty of the Arabian horse. It's an incredible opportunity to go to these shows and witness our love for this breed firsthand. I've also met so many great people who have turned into friends. To be surrounded by those
- O: What do you love most about horse show photography?
- A: As cheesy as it sounds, being able to capture the special behindthe-scenes moments. A horse show is so much more than just time spent in your class. It's a combination of every moment it took to get there. I love when an image is able to convey the joy of winning a class, the intense focus of a warm-up ride, or the adoration a rider feels for their horse.



O: What are your favorite types of shots to get?

A: I like putting an artistic spin on typical atmosphere photos. I love taking a more fine art-styled shot that still encapsulates the energy of a horse show. Whether that be a unique angle, trying to get the lighting to your advantage, or really focusing on the little details, I'm always trying to make the horses and riders look their best.

O: What would be your dream shot?

A: I truly love shooting under-saddle horses, but halter horses have a special place in my heart. I enjoy shooting halter horses because of how challenging it is to capture the Arabian in its liberty. It would provide ample opportunities for creative shots that capture the essence of an Arabian

A: To continue to grow my business. I would love to do more farm shoots, and work with different barns in my area. I also look forward to seeing everyone at shows this year and making new connections. Say hello if you see me!

Regular Meeting

August 10, 2024

Roz Gilbert made a motion to correct the June special meeting minutes to state Lynda would contact Ron from R&J Arena, not Roz. Val seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mary motioned to accept treasurer report, Roz seconded motion. Motion carried.

Discussion regarding show offerings in 2025, including offering Value Shows again in May and the current WSCA/AU show in June. Mesa motioned to have one show committee and maintain the current June show location and date in 2025. Kaitlyn seconded the motion. Motion carried. Show committee to meet by the end of August to discuss details to bring to the next regular meeting.

Lynda brought forward the Ambassador program update. Consensus by the group to combine programs into one, Rated, Open and non-show. Membership contact has been made to make awareness of the program offerings with the change to the chair. Chair Kaitlyn has been reviewing prize options.

Royalty Program will have Kaitlyn as the chair with her duties as Youth Coordinator. Current applicant will continue process for 2025.

Discussion on filling vacant board position occurred. Also, further discussion on membership totals and ways to continue to attract new members.

AHA Convention delegates – Lynda is the first delegate with the duty of President. Kaitlyn indicated she would fill the second delegate position. Mesa will be the alternate. Convention will be in person in Reno, NV in November.

Board member nominations will be open to fill at the October meeting. No officer positions are open to be filled.

Region 10 is holding a special meeting on August 11th. Current agenda includes discussion regarding a proposal for class entry gate for Walk-trot. Location of the Region 10 2025 Championship horse show. Finally, a proposal to allow for a new club within Region 10.
